The beforementioned members are eligible for another term according to SAC rules of procedure, subject to the submission of renomination by any Party. Both Dr. Mallett and Dr. Warner have demonstrated outstanding commitment and have brought valuable contributions to the SAC. Therefore, the SAC strongly recommends that the Parties support the renewal of their terms, considering Dr. Mallett as full member for her new term.

This commitment aligns with the IAI's policy on Gender, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion. Currently, there is an underrepresentation of Central America and the Caribbean in the SAC's composition, which the committee aims to address.
